Overview

Appropriately managed medical emergencies can prevent a casualty's condition deteriorating. This course will help educate and build confidence in recognising and managing acute medical emergencies in a variety of environments. Open discussions are encouraged on both personal experience and on scenarios that the candidate may experience in their working environment.

- Anaphylaxis
- Angina /Heart Attack
- Epilepsy
- Asthma
- Low Blood Sugar (Diabetes)
- Drug box and resuscitation equipment

- Be able to recognise some common medical conditions
- Be able to provide immediate basic life saving management
- Gain knowledge on appropriate medications
- Be able to know when and how to use medications
- Understand how to provide appropriate aftercare
- Become familiar in basic emergency equipment, how to use and maintain it
